- Schedule individual curriculum conversations with teachers to gain a line of sight into how the planned curriculum is being implemented in classrooms to meet individual student needs.

- Sharpen the focus of Collaborative Planning Processes for differentiation using the Maker Model (Content, Process, Product, and Environment) to support teachers to differentiate the curriculum for all learners.
- Joining Special Education Curriculum Cluster Communication and Emergent Literacy PLC and associated professional development.
- Developing teacher's knowledge and understanding of differentiation for communication and emergent literacy.
- Develop teacher's knowledge and understanding of differentiation and student engagement through imbedded Positive Behaviour for Learning lessons.
- Developing teacher's knowledge and understanding of interpreting data and 'knowing your students' through individual data conversations.
